Outstanding Faculty:

Bryan Reece, Cerritos College

Bryan Reece, a Cerritos College professor of political science, has performed outstanding service in launching Tribal Technology (Tribe Tech). The project assists Tribal Governments and tribally sponsored programs in making the best possible use of information technology to enhance life in their communities

Outstanding Program: (co-winners)

Architecture Program, College of the Sequoias

Rolando L. Gonzalez, Instructor College of the Sequoias Architecture Program under the leadership of Rolando L. Gonzalez participates in the Cal Poly Design Village Competition and has partnered with the City of Visalia to design bus stops in a joint project with city planners.

Bilingual Occupational Program, Hartnell College

Hartnell College Bilingual Occupational Program provides bilingual classes for students in Occupational Education programs. Sixty bilingual classes are taught each semester utilizing textbooks in English with supplemental literature in Spanish taught by a bilingual instructor. The program has an 85 percent retention rate and is highly acclaimed by the business community.

Excellence in Leadership:

Robert Pile, Chaffey College

Robert Pile, Associate Vice President for Economic & Community Development at Chaffey College, worked with the City of Chino to develop the Chaffey College/Chino Information Technology Center. In addition, he partnered with Verizon, Gateway, Enterasys and Cisco to provide the equipment for the center. Over a three year period, Robert provided the leadership for faculty to develop cutting-edge curricula and enhanced the City of Chino's economic development opportunities by creating a center where students receive excellent training to become employed in the IT industry.

Excellence in Partnership:

Cerritos College in partnership with Lockheed Martin

The Lockheed Martin Aerospace Corporation (LMAC) and Cerritos College have formed a partnership to meet a critical need for composite fabricators and technicians to build the F-22 jet fighter and the new joint strike fighter. Lockheed Martin faced a critical shortage of employees trained in composites. Cerritos is the only community college in the state that offers Composites Technology certificate and degree programs. Through the partnership the college will develop four levels of training in composite technology that will be delivered to Lockheed Martin employees for at least 10 years. Lockheed has already booked almost \$1 million in training and services with the college.
