### **CAREERS - Exploring Whole Student Design to Connect Students to Careers**

For many California Community College students, the road to achieving their higher education and career goals is not a smooth one. Students come to us with significant barriers to success ranging from economic hardship to food insecurity to homelessness to mental health issues, and the list goes on. If these barriers go unrecognized in the design and delivery of our education programs and services, our systemwide goal of cutting equity gaps in half by 2022 and eliminating them entirely by 2028 will not be met. Preconference participants will hear system leader perspectives on the benefits of integration, formulate and share Whole Student design ideas, and learn from innovators implementing holistic design solutions aimed at improving students' educational outcomes, career options, and economic mobility.

Do you oversee Public Safety programs in Fire Technology, Law Enforcement, EMT and/or Paramedic, and would like the opportunity to network with other Deans and VP's that oversee these programs? Are you aware of how the funding formula will impact your college's bottom line, or do you have an Instructional Services Agreement (ISA) with which you are unfamiliar, but now find you're the person in charge? If you said yes to any of these questions, then please consider attending the Statewide Public Safety Deans' Retreat. Our first meeting of this kind was held in August 2018. Attendees overwhelmingly requested that this level of convening continue, and asked that the time and space be connected to CCCAOE. Representatives from California State Fire Marshal's Office and Peace Officer Standards and Training will be on hand to answer your questions, and ample time will be given for group discussion and problem-solving around these valuable, but complicated, instructional programs.
